
On February 1st, we had our annual ministry meeting and we were all ecstatic about Conviction's increase in ministry this past year. In 2012 we saw 16,062 more people than in the previous year. We did 308 more events, there were 426 more 1st time salvations, and 2,653 more rededications than in 2011. This next year we

are going to start to focus on the vision of this ministry to reach all of the prisons in America. To do this we want to build a Discipleship Center that will be used to raise up pastors to take the gospel of Jesus Christ into America's prisons.

Here is one of the stories that our missionary Larry told us about during our meeting with our missionaries on February 2nd.

One Sunday I went into Charles Webster Detention Center.

One of the men that came out to my services was a male prostitute.

He took a seat right in front of me. At the end of the service, I gave an invitation of salvation and that night he gave his life to Jesus. On the following Monday he was released from jail.

While I was watching television on that following Wednesday, I saw that the man who gave his life to Christ on Sunday had been stabbed to death earlier that morning. I was able to locate and tell his father that his son had given his life to Jesus on Sunday in the county jail.

His father was so relieved to know that his son had given his life to Jesus.

Thank you Jesus for saving this man!

Dear Partners,

On Friday, March 1st, our beloved North Texas missionary, **Tiffany Georgous**, was called home. Our sister, Tiffany, was only 43 years old and she and her husband, James, have six children. They live in Cleveland, Texas.

Tiffany was a go getter for the gospel, even at the end of her battle with cancer; and even though she was ill, she would help James send their monthly ministry report into the office. Just a few months ago she was still going into the prisons, the halfway homes, or churches with James to minister. She would say, "I can't lie in bed any longer; I have to get up and go with James." If you asked her how she could get up and go even after a chemo therapy treatment, she would tell you "I don't have time to feel sorry for myself, I have work to do for the Lord and I have to work on getting better." Even in the last moments of consciousness, Tiffany showed where her heart was. One of the hospice nurses was trying to get Tiffany to relax. She asked Tiffany to envision herself in a favorite place where she felt safe. The nurse was shocked when Tiffany told her that the place she loved and felt safe was "prison." What an incredible missionary, who never forgot those she was called to reach.

She was such a strong woman of God, and she lived her life in a manner that we all should live our lives. She showed others how to live strong and courageous. Just 4 weeks ago she managed to come to Conviction's yearly missionary gathering in Albuquerque. We thank God for this time of fellowship that we were able to have with her.

Tiffany was that light in the dark. James and Tiffany came aboard last year with Conviction, and in just one year they reached 6,135 people with the gospel of Jesus Christ. They had 500 first time salvations and they had 1,239 people who rededicated their lives back to the Lord. They also added 10 other missionaries underneath them. When you see all that she was doing for the kingdom, it makes no sense to us that God would take her home so soon. This is one of those times that we want to say, "Lord, I don't understand why you would call Tiffany home, when she had so much to do here, but I know that Your ways are higher than our ways, therefore we just have to walk by faith and not by sight, we have to trust in You."
